Pricing

Each event detailed in this brochure has been scrutinised to ensure the proposed fee is as low as possible.

Following feedback from schools and partners, we have made the prices for each course the same for ALL delegates. This means that there are no additional charges to delegate places from academy and independent schools, please note that this does not include VAT where applicable.

Booking Arrangements

Places for all courses can be booked by registered users through our online system SLA Online – https://secure2.sla-online.co.uk/?logo=10.

Places are confirmed via the system once the delegate name has been added and the course checked out of the shopping basket. The Apprenticeship and School Development Team will also send out an email reminder one week before courses are due to take place.

When booking places on multiple courses, these can all be 'checked out' of your shopping basket at the same time, using the same purchase order number. There is no need to check each course out separately (unless you wish to use different order numbers).

Commitments and Cancellations

Establishments will not be charged if cancellations of bookings are received more than five working days prior to the event. If cancellations are not made within five working days this will result in the full cost of the course being applied, this also applies in the case of non-attendance, which is identified from the attendance list. Any courses that are an exception to this, will detail the cancellation policy in the course details and confirmation/reminders.

If for any reason we have to cancel or postpone training, we will notify all delegates booked onto the course as quickly as possible; a full refund will be given in the event of cancellation by us.

Payment

Accepted bookings will be treated as a firm commitment. The following billing arrangements will then apply:

- By booking on to a course, Local Authority schools will have authorised a transfer of the full costs from their school budget
- 'Cheque book' schools and other clients will be invoiced
- Non-Cumbrian schools will need to send a cheque to cover payment in advance of the course to secure the booking. Please make all cheques payable to 'Cumbria County Council'.

All charges to Cumbrian schools will be made at the end of each term.

Education Guru's Wellbeing and Mindfulness for Primary Schools

Course Outline:

Wellbeing is increasingly being recognised as vital for effective learning. Stress, anxiety, and other mental health issues are big barriers to both teaching and learning. Statistics show that at least three children in every class will have mental health issues that obstruct learning for themselves and possibly others in their peer group. Teachers' health is of upmost importance both for themselves and for the children they teach. Without general mental health, their potential is compromised as is their pupils' learning. But there are lots we can do to help pupils and staff be more relaxed and happy, from using techniques such as breathing, meditation and yoga, to taking learning outdoors. This course will help teachers develop skills and strategies to improve their own mental health and wellbeing. It will also enable them to begin to deliver a programme in their own schools to improve the wellbeing of other staff and pupils.
