Lindale C of E Primary School

Lindale C of E Primary School is a small school with 54 pupils attending (that includes nursery) and it is made up of three classes: Nursery, Reception, Year one and two, Year three and four and finally Year five and six. The school is located Lindale, Grange-over-Sands.

Performances

During December 2022, Lindale School did a performance of the musical "No one Wraps like an Elf" after practising for many weeks. In the past, they have done performances such as Peter Pan, Robin Hood and Alice in Wonderland. As it gets closer to the performances, key stage two practise and dramatise the performance until they are ready for the dress rehearsal.

Outside areas

Key stage one and reception have a playground at the front of the school with equipment for them to play with; nursery also share this with the younger pupils. The equipment on the playground includes a sand pit, a slide, a shed with bicycles and scooters inside and a small wooden house. Down at the bottom of the field, Lindale School have a gazebo with a wellbeing club that is held there every Friday lunchtime by Mrs. Coulston. At the top of the field, they have an oak tree, that has been there for many years, that has an array of wooden seats and a large wooden armchair. The key stage two outside area consists of a field which has a large grass area that at some break times the pupils play football on. Finally, Lindale School has a climbing frame with two orange bars students like to do tricks on, a climbing net and some tires that students spin around on.

Fundraising

At Lindale School, they do a large amount of fundraising for different charities such as raising money for crises going on like the conflict in Ukraine. Annually, Lindale School take part in Christmas jumper day where the children get to come in with a Christmas jumper on if they pay a pound for save the children. At around Christmas time, the school hands out leaflets for shoebox gifts which is where parents and children can put small presents into a shoebox that then gets sent to a country where children cannot afford presents. Every year, Lindale School celebrate Children in Need/ Pudsey day, the pupils dress in either yellow or spotty as they raise money for the charity. Finally, they celebrate World Book Day and the pupils get a one-pound voucher whilst coming into school wearing a costume of a book character as they raising awareness for children who don't have proper learning facilities or even a book and occasionally they bring in the book that the character is from.
